The Church, the Far Right and the Claim to Christianity

15 March (Sat) at 10.30amRevd Dr Helen Paynter is coming to Bridge United Reformed Church in Otley to speak on 'The Church, the Far Right and the Claim to Christianity!' Revd Dr. Helen Paynter is Director of the Centre for the Study of Bible and Violence, as well as an academic and educator of biblical and theological education at Bristol Baptist College. She has researched and published extensively on topics of religion and violence. Helen is coming to Otley to speak to the topics central to this book and to open a conversation about how Christian communities and individuals grapple with the Far Right. You don't need to have read the book! Just bring your questions and thoughts. Together we will look at such questions as: What is the Far Right? How and why does it claim Christianity? What can we do about this? Why is the Far Right influential, and why is it both compelling and dangerous, including for Christian communities? This event, hosted by The Bridge United Reformed Church of Otley, aims to explore a timely and difficult topic. We very much hope to engage in free, frank and constructive dialogue.
